

2017 TD Bank Group-CCA Collection Research Grants Guidelines for Application

The CCA in the framework of the CCA's Doctoral Students Program offers summer residencies to support Canadian PhD students in pursuing archival research based on our collection.

Applications to the TD Bank Group-CCA Collection Research Grants must be made on the designated online application form. Submissions should be made in either English or French. The online application should be complete at the time of submission and include all of the following:

- Online Application Form
- Abstract of PhD project (500 words)
- **Research Proposal** (500 words), identifying the items in the CCA Collection of interest.
- **Curriculum Vitae**, detailing education, professional experience, publications, awards, and working languages, as well as any other relevant information.

The complete application should be sent through the CCA online application portal no later than **Friday 31 March 2017 by 5 pm** (Eastern Standard Time). Documents faxed, mailed or sent electronically will not be accepted. Only documents submitted through the CCA online application portal will be accepted.

Notification date: end of April 2017.

Eligibility and Terms of Residency

Eligible are all PhD students currently enrolled in a doctoral program in history and theory of architecture, planning, humanities, communications and social sciences in Canada, regardless of citizenship. A TD Bank Group-CCA Collection Research Grant provides a monthly stipend of \$2,000 CAD to cover the travel, housing, and living expenses of each recipient for a residency in Montréal. The grant is non-renewable.

Residencies at the CCA—ranging from two to three months—must take place from June to August 2017. Attendance to a one week seminar, a topical "Toolkit for Today", which takes place end of June or beginning of July and which provides scholars with new concepts, tools and methods for their own research, is required.

The CCA will select candidates according to a set of criteria, the originality and relevance of the proposed research and how it relates to the overall PhD project, the curricula vitae and the relation to CCA's main line of investigation.
