On a cold evening in Nunavik, in any given village, one might find families knocking on their neighbours doors to participate in nightly social activities. Their communities are currently arranged in suburban housing typologies, designed with western practices in mind. The discrepancy between their neighbourhood design and their lifestyles and climate results in a lack of important public spaces in which to participate in community rituals which are essential to their culture.

We propose a new do-it-yourself housing typology, a modular indoor connection between two existing homes, facilitating indoor contact between families, creating new public spaces and minimizing heating costs for the inhabitants.
